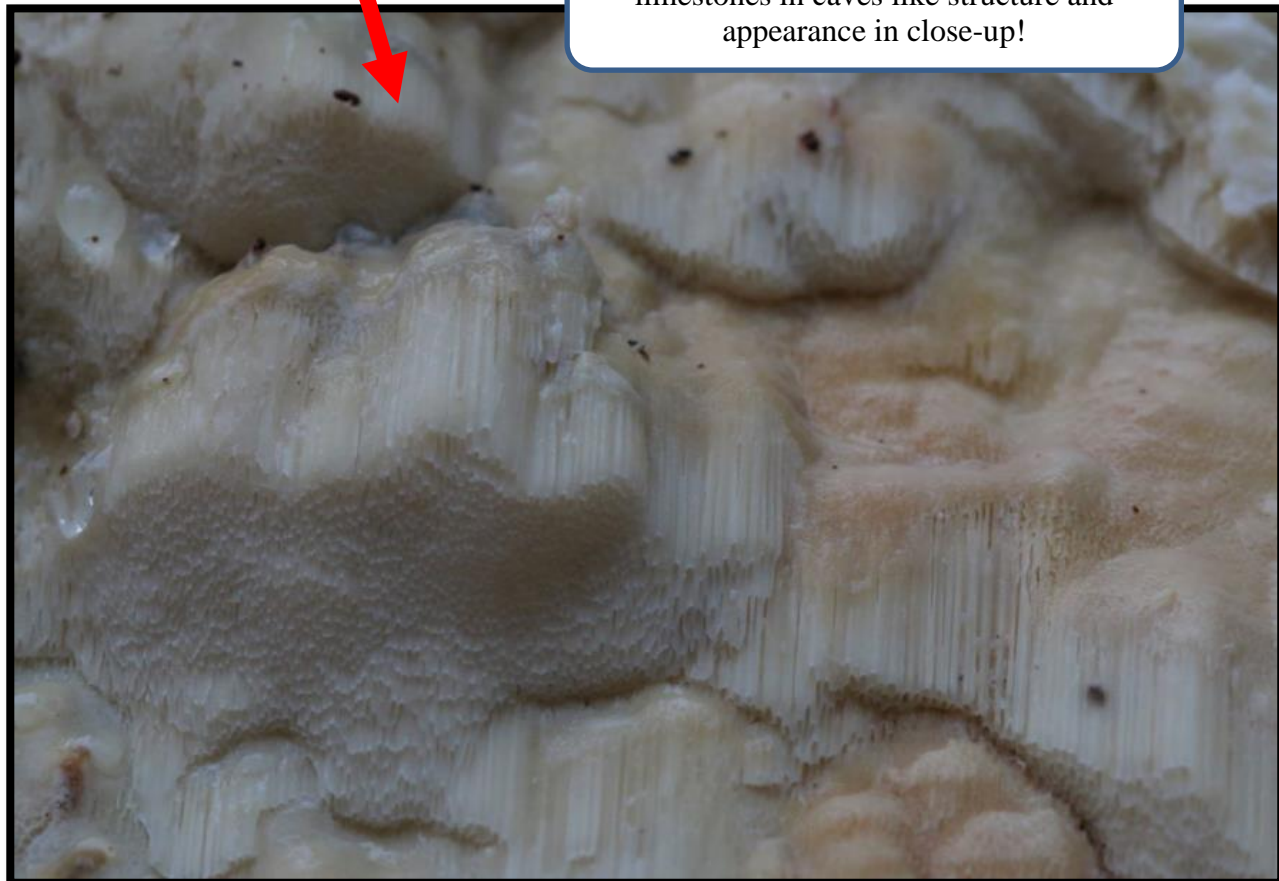




Ecological value of the dead biodiversity:

appearance in close-up!



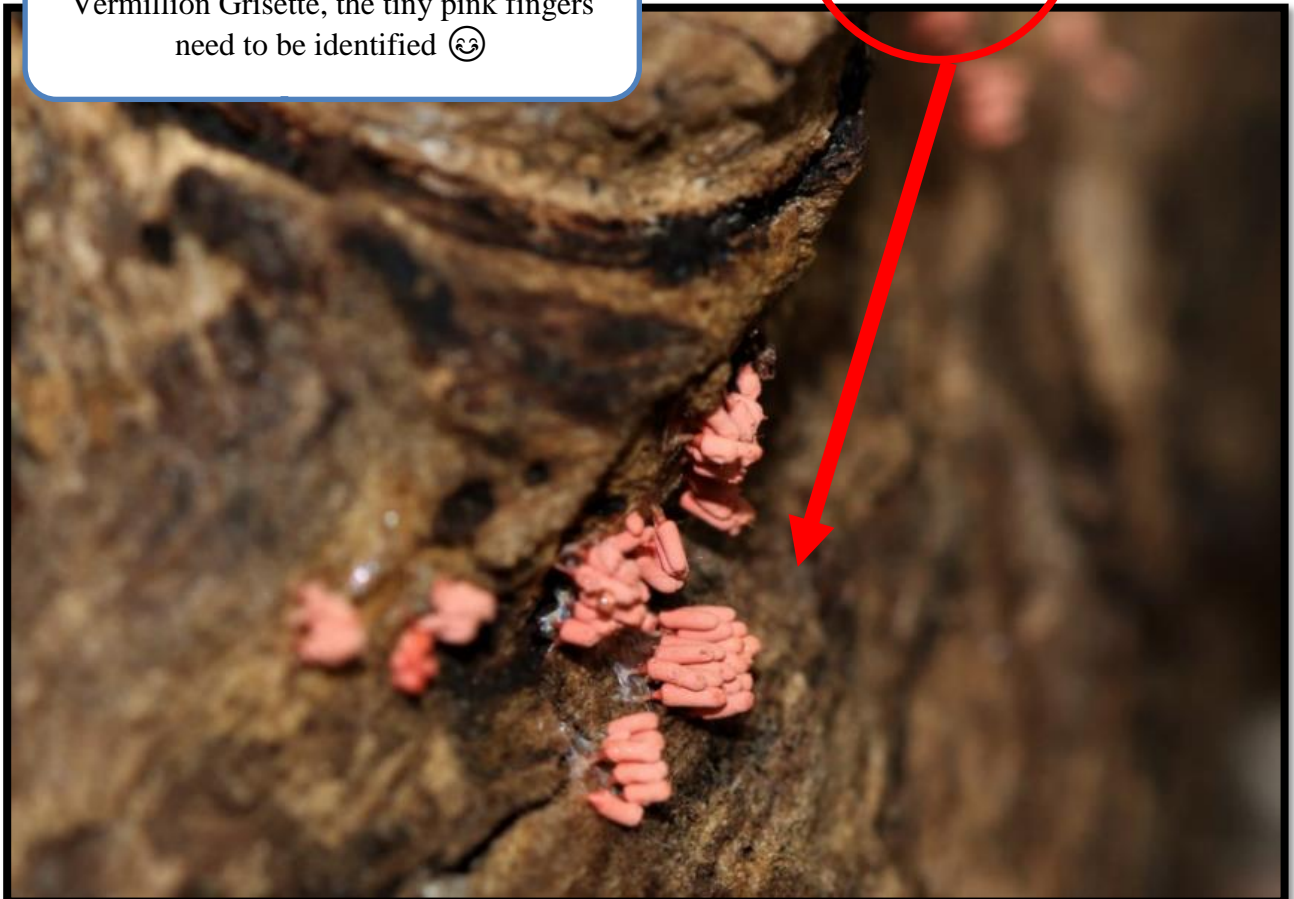


Four different fungi species can be spotted within these two pictures, I couldn't confirm their species identity at this stage 🙄





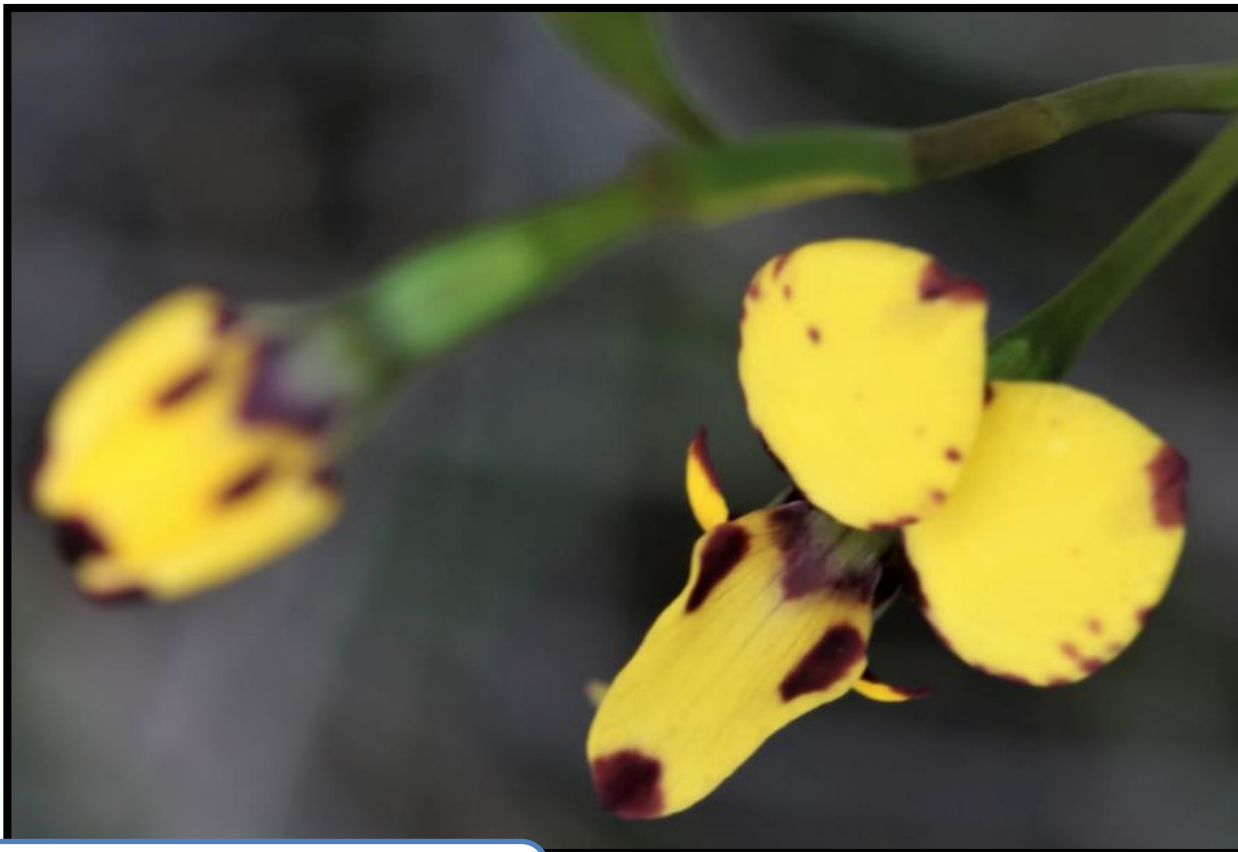
What appears to be a stink bug on fungi-
